**The History Channel's "Modern Marvels"
Will Highlight Waukesha Engine in June 21st Episode**

WAUKESHA, Wis. – Waukesha Engine and its employees will be featured in a new episode of "Modern Marvels" which will air on The History Channel, Wednesday, June 21 at 9 p.m. CDT and at 10 p.m. EDT.

The episode, titled "Horsepower" will explore an assortment of machinery that delivers impressive amounts of horsepower. Waukesha Engine will be the focus of a segment on high-horsepower engines that are used in a variety of industrial applications and for on-site electrical power generation.

"Modern Marvels" will take viewers into the Waukesha Engine plant at 1101 W. St. Paul Ave. here to see how engines are manufactured and assembled. Viewers also will learn about how and where the engines are used, the types of fuel on which they run, how they generate horsepower and how they help the end users accomplish vital tasks.

The show's producers were particularly intrigued by the company's largest models – including the AT, a 16-cylinder, 35-ton unit rated at 4,500 HP and the soon-to-be introduced APG 3000 (4,400 HP) – and the fact that they are powered by natural gas or biogas.

In early April, a "Modern Marvels" crew spent an entire day at Waukesha Engine filming the manufacturing process and talking with employees.

Celebrating ingenuity, invention and imagination brought to life on a grand scale, The History Channel's "Modern Marvels" is a long-running television series that tells the fascinating stories of the doers, dreamers and sometime-schemers who created everyday items, technological breakthroughs and man-made wonders.
